Dear Parents,

Your child is learning to make more words by adding the suffixes *s*, *ed*, and *ing* to base words. For example, the base word *stop* can be expanded to *stops-stopped-stopping*. You can help. Read and discuss the rule in each box. Then help your child find word examples. Next, have your child write the words in the blanks. Your child will revisit these rules many times this year and in the years to come, so that over time your child can apply them with confidence. Knowing these basic rules helps your child learn to spell hundreds of words.

Choose words, Follow the rules.

| RULE 1. For most words, just add s, ed, or ing. | RULE 2. For words ending in silent e, just add s, but drop the final e before adding ed or ing. |

| RULE 3. For words ending in one vowel and one consonant, just add s, but double the final consonant before adding ed or ing. | RULE 4. For words ending in consonant-y, just add ing, but change the y to i before adding es or ed. |

| add ing | add ing |
