Dear Parents,

Your child is working with many word patterns at school. Some word patterns are easier than others. Word patterns that contain a vowel-r are more difficult to spell, because the r changes the usual sound of the vowel. Also, the same sound can be spelled in more than one way. In this activity, you and your child work with words spelled with er, ir, and ur—and they all sound the same. You also work with word patterns or and ore. Again, the two spellings sound the same.

First, discuss the directions with your child. Then guide your child through the activity, letting your child do as much as possible without your help. Next, check the answers together.
